During my research on the Alix family of father and daughter deaths of Willer and Drucilla Alix, I have sustained a lot of information about their lives. Willer Alix Sr. was born on January 16, 1893 in Bronx Bridge, Louisiana to the parents of Julius Alix and Mary Payne. Willer was a Railroad Mechanic Helper. He then moved to Houston, Harris Texas where he married Carmen Joseph, and in that union they produced thirteen children. Starting with their oldest daughter Drucilla Alix, Mary E., Samuel J., Doris C., John Henry, Dorothy Mae, Sanders Clarence, Willer Jr., Alma Delores, Jewel, Matthew Robert and Noble Joseph Benjamin. Willer Alix and his family lived at 3106 Delano St. In the year of 1959 on May 24, Willer Alix Sr. died at the age of 66, from being struck by an automobile, leaving him with a fractured skull, but his immediate cause of death was Cerebral Hemorrhage which is a subtype of intracranial hemorrhage that occurs within the brain tissue itself. This can be caused by brain trauma, or it can occur spontaneously in hemorrhagic stroke. Non-traumatic intracerebral hemorrhage is a spontaneous bleeding into the brain tissues. He now is buried at College

Park Memorial Cemetery with his daughter Drucilla, who died at the age of 18 years from Pulmonary Tuberculosis, which is a contagious bacterial infection that mainly involves the lungs, but may spread to other organs.

Drucilla was born in Houston, Harris Texas on January 16, 1916. She was still attending school when she died. The historic events that both people lived through were: World War 2 (1941-1945), The Holocaust "Hitler" (1933-1945), The Great Depression (1930's).

A **cerebral hemorrhage** (or **intracerebral hemorrhage**, **ICH**), is a subtype of intracranial hemorrhage that occurs within the brain tissue itself. Intracerebral hemorrhage can be caused by brain trauma, or it can occur spontaneously in hemorrhagic stroke. Non-traumatic intracerebral haemorrhage is a spontaneous bleeding into the brain tissue.^[1]

A cerebral hemorrhage is an **intra-axial hemorrhage**; that is, it occurs within the brain tissue rather than outside of it. The other category of intracranial hemorrhage is extra-axial hemorrhage, such as epidural, subdural, and subarachnoid hematomas, which all occur within the skull but outside of the brain tissue. There are two main kinds of intra-axial hemorrhages: **intraparenchymal hemorrhage** and intraventricular hemorrhages. As with other types of hemorrhages within the skull, intraparenchymal bleeds are a serious medical emergency because they can increase intracranial pressure. The mortality rate for intraparenchymal bleeds is over 40%.^[2]

Prevalence

It accounts for 20% of all cases of cerebrovascular disease in the US, behind cerebral thrombosis (40%) and cerebral embolism (30%).^[3]

It is two or more times more prevalent in African-American patients.^[4]

Causes

Intracerebral bleeds are the second most common cause of stroke, accounting for 30–60% of hospital admissions for stroke.^[1] High blood pressure raises the risk of spontaneous intracerebral hemorrhage by two to six times.^[1] More common in adults than in children, intraparenchymal bleeds due to trauma are usually due to penetrating head trauma, but can also be due to depressed skull fractures, acceleration-deceleration trauma,^{[5][6][7]} rupture of an aneurysm or arteriovenous malformation (AVM), and bleeding within a tumor. A very small proportion is due to cerebral venous sinus thrombosis.

Risk factors

Risk factors for ICH include:^[8]

- Hypertension
- Diabetes
- Menopause
- Current cigarette smoking
- Alcoholic drinks (≥ 2 /day)
- Caffeine

Symptoms


Patients with intraparenchymal bleeds have symptoms that correspond to the functions controlled by the area of the brain that is damaged by the bleed.^[9] Other symptoms include those that indicate a rise in intracranial pressure due to a large mass putting pressure on the brain.^[9] Intracerebral hemorrhages are often misdiagnosed as Subarachnoid hemorrhages due to the similarity in symptoms and signs.

Diagnosis


Intraparenchymal hemorrhage can be recognized on CT scans because blood appears brighter than other tissue and is separated from the inner table of the skull by brain tissue. The tissue surrounding a bleed is often less dense than the rest of the brain due to edema, and therefore shows up lighter on the CT scan.

Treatment

Treatment depends substantially of the type of ICH. Rapid CT scan and other diagnostic measures are used to chose proper treatment, which may include both medication and surgery.

Medication

- Giving Factor VIIa within 4 hours limits the bleeding and formation of an hematoma However, it also increases the risk of thromboembolism. ^[10]
- Antihypertensives are given to stabilize the mean arterial pressure at below 130 mmHg, but without causing excessive hypotension. ^[10]
 - Mannitol is effective in acutely reducing raised intracranial pressure.
- Acetaminophen may be needed to avoid hyperthermia, and to relieve headache. ^[10]
- Frozen plasma, vitamin K, protamine, or platelet transfusions are given in case of a coagulopathy. ^[10]
- Fosphenytoin or other anticonvulsant is given in case of seizures or lobar hemorrhage. ^[10]
- Antacids are given to prevent gastric ulcers, a condition somehow linked with ICH. ^[10]
- Corticosteroids, in concert with antihypertensives, reduces swelling. ^[11]

Surgery

Surgery is required if the hematoma is greater than 3 cm, if there is a structural vascular lesion or lobar hemorrhage in a young patient. ^[10]

- A catheter may be passed into the brain vasculature to close off or dilate blood vessels, avoiding rather invasive surgical procedures. ^[12]
- Aspiration by stereotactic surgery or endoscopic drainage may be used in basal ganglia hemorrhages, although successful reports are limited. ^[10]

Other treatment

- Tracheal intubation is indicated in patients with decreased level of consciousness or other risk of airway obstruction. ^[10]
- IV fluids are given to maintain fluid balance, using normotonic rather than hypotonic fluids. ^[10]

Prognosis

The risk of death from an intraparenchymal bleed in traumatic brain injury is especially high when the injury occurs in the brain stem. ^[2] Intraparenchymal bleeds within the medulla are almost always fatal, because they cause damage to cranial nerve X, the vagus nerve, which plays an important role in blood circulation and breathing. ^[5] This kind of hemorrhage can also occur in the cortex or subcortical areas, usually in the frontal or temporal lobes when due to head injury, and sometimes in the cerebellum. ^{[5][13]}

For spontaneous ICH seen on CT scan, the death rate (mortality) is 34–50% by 30 days after the insult. ^[1]

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Causes

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Pulmonary tuberculosis is caused by the bacteria *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* (*M. tuberculosis*). You can get tuberculosis by breathing in air droplets from a cough or sneeze of an infected person.

In the United States, most people will recover from primary TB infection without further evidence of the disease. The infection may stay asleep or nonactive (dormant) for years and then reactivate.

Most people who develop symptoms of a TB infection first became infected in the past. However, in some cases, the disease may become active within weeks after the primary infection.

The following people are at higher risk for active TB:

Elderly
Infants

People with weakened immune systems, for example due to AIDS, chemotherapy, or antirejection medicines given after an organ transplant

Your risk of contracting TB increases if you:

Are in frequent contact with people who have the disease
Have poor nutrition
Live in crowded or unsanitary living conditions

The following factors may increase the rate of TB infection in a population:

Increase in HIV infections
Increase in number of homeless people (poor environment and nutrition)
The appearance of drug-resistant strains of TB

In the United States, there are approximately 10 cases of TB per 100,000 people. However, rates vary dramatically by area of residence and socioeconomic class.

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

Exams and Tests

Examination may show:

Clubbing of the fingers or toes (in people with advanced disease)
Enlarged or tender lymph nodes in the neck or other areas
Fluid around a lung
Unusual breath sounds (crackles)

Tests may include:

Biopsy of the affected tissue (rare)
Bronchoscopy
Chest CT scan
Chest x-ray
Interferon-gamma blood test such as the QFT-Gold test to test for TB infection
Sputum examination and cultures
Thoracentesis
Tuberculin skin test

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Treatment

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The goal of treatment is to cure the infection with drugs that fight the TB bacteria. Treatment of active pulmonary TB will always involve a combination of many drugs (usually four drugs). It is continued until lab tests show which medicines work best.

You may need to take many different pills at different times of the day. This may be difficult for some people. However, it is very important that you take the pills the way your health care provider instructed.

When people do not take their tuberculosis medications as recommended, the infection becomes much more difficult to treat. Sometimes, the drugs no longer help treat the infection.

Treatment usually lasts for 6 months, but longer courses may be needed for people with AIDS or who get better slowly.

You may need to be admitted to a hospital to avoid spreading the disease to others until you are no longer contagious.

Your doctor or nurse is required by law to report your TB illness to the local health department. Your health care team will be sure that you receive the best care for your TB.

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Symptoms may improve in 2 - 3 weeks. A chest x-ray will not show this improvement until later. The outlook is excellent if pulmonary TB is diagnosed early and treatment is begun quickly.

TB is a preventable disease, even in those who have been exposed to an infected person. Skin testing (PPD) for TB is used in high risk populations or in people who may have been exposed to TB, such as health care workers.

A positive skin test indicates TB exposure and an inactive infection. Discuss preventive therapy with your doctor. People who have been exposed to TB should be skin tested immediately and have a follow-up test at a later date, if the first test is negative.

Prompt treatment is extremely important in controlling the spread of TB from those who have active TB disease to those who have never been infected with TB.

Some countries with a high incidence of TB give people a BCG vaccination to prevent TB. However, the effectiveness of this vaccine is controversial and it is not routinely used in the United States.

People who have had BCG may still be skin tested for TB. Discuss the test results (if positive) with your doctor.

Clara Nell Smith was born to the parents of James G. Smith and Sarah Crawford in Houston, Rosharion Texas on November 20, 1927. She worked as a Stoke Clerk in the business of Jewelry at a store called Corrington's. She lived at 2514 Leeland St.; but she never married. Clara's parents were both born in Houston, Texas. She died on August 20, 1952 at the tender age of 24 at Memorial Hospital after 7 days of being in the hospital from Cerebral Embolus, which is the sudden blocking of a cerebral artery by a clot or foreign material which has been brought to its site of lodgment by the blood. Clara Nell Smith is now buried at College Park Memorial Cemetery which is a cemetery that was only where blacks were to be buried during her time of living. Clara Smith lived through many world events such as: (1936) Spanish Civil War "Lincoln Brigades" also (1941-1945) WW2 "Pearl Harbor" and the (1933-1945) The Holocaust "Hitler".







She had a baby in her arms, she hollered at us chillun & said, 'You chilluns git off dat fence & go learn yore ABC's.' I thought she crazy telling us that, for we had never been 'lowed to learn noting at all like reading & writing. I learned but it was after surrender & i was over ten years old. Thomas Kyle Crawford was a four year old Negro male who is buried in College Park Memorial Cemetery. He was born May 17, 1908 and died June 12, 1912. His cause of death was being burnt; and how it happened is still anonymously unknown. I found his tombstone/plot walking towards the front of the cemetery. It caught my attention of how big in size the plot was and to have only one tombstone there. To my surprise I realized after reading the tombstone, that buried under my feet was only a four year old child- Thomas Kyle Crawford. From that point, I obtained an interest to research him and also his Genealogy.

The first week and a half, as a group we were trained by Genealogy researchers/professionals. During that time we learned about how to investigate our person, analyze our data, and scrutinize (our) the 'deliverable'. Starting on our research, I immediately found his death certificate. After getting excited about the research, it got tougher to find more information.

Finally, I gathered more information with the help of Mrs. Deborah Sloan and Mr. George Allen. They helped me to find his mother (Rosa Watson) and his grandparents (Stoky Watson).

Puzzling up the information that I found: Rosa Watson and Bob Crawford were married and then divorced. They had two children together – Thomas Kyle Crawford and Austin Crawford (who was found to be two years old in the 1910 census). When divorced, Rosa Watson went back to live with her parents. No information was found on the father. Thomas Kyle Crawford lived through world events such as: 1908 (Federal Bureau of Investigation was established) 1909 (William Howard Taft becomes President) 1912(Theodore Roosevelt shot but not killed while campaigning for the Bull Moose Party). Overall, this has been an experience for me that I will never forget.




